Master of Science in Psychology - w/emphasis in General Psychology (Fast-Track Bachelors + Masters) - Option II Non-Thesis (36 hours)

The Fast-Track Bachelors + Masters degree program allows undergraduate students in the Psychology program to begin coursework towards the nonthesis option of the Master of Science in Psychology w/emphasis in General Psychology program during their senior year at East Texas A&M University. Students can earn a B.S. and M.S. degree in five years upon completion of degree requirements for both degrees. For this Fast-Track Bachelors + Masters program, 6 credits of graduate coursework can be applied to both the BS and MS degrees. Once admitted, the BS/MS candidate must maintain a 3.00 Undergraduate GPA. In the final semester of the student's undergraduate program, a new online Apply Texas Application for the master's Fast-Track Bachelors + Masters program must be submitted to gain admission and continue taking classes to complete the master's program.
